London Northwestern Railway confirms return of train services to Marston Vale Line

London Northwestern Railway (LNR) has today confirmed the return of train services to the Marston Vale Line from next week as national lockdown measures ease further.

Rail replacement buses have been operating on the line between Bedford and Bletchley during the latest period of lockdown, with passenger numbers extremely low.

However, with shops, gyms and community centres preparing to open their doors, LNR will reintroduce a limited number of trains during the morning and afternoon peak periods from Monday-Saturday. The returning services have been selected in consultation with local colleges and community groups.

The services will resume on Monday 12 April. Rail replacement buses will continue to run at other times.

Passengers are being reminded of the latest Government advice to minimise journeys where possible and to avoid the busiest times if travelling.

Lawrence Bowman, customer experience director for London Northwestern Railway, said:

"With lockdown measures easing further, now is the right time to reintroduce trains to the Marston Vale Line to help our passengers travel with confidence.

"We encourage passengers using the train to maintain social distancing on board and remind all customers that everyone aged over 11 must wear a face covering by law, unless exempt on medical grounds."
